Cleary-Kirby Wedding

C. Cleary, Avalon Terrace. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Fr. H. A. Summers, P.P., with Nuptial Mass at 9 a.m. As the bridal party entered the Church, which was beautifully decorated for the occasion, Mendelshon's Wedding March was impressively played by Mr. Ignatius Rumboldt, who during the Mass his rendition of sacred music and singing of Hymn to the Sacred Heart, O Lord I am not worthy, and Schubert's Ave Maria was magnificent.

The bride was given in marriage by her father. She made a very charming and memorable picture in gown of white brocaded satin with sweetheart neckline, and her full length embroidered veil was held in place with headdress of ostrich tips. She carried a white ivory prayer book with satin streamers entwined with rosebuds and gypsophila. The bride's only

attendant was her sister Joan, who was exquisitely gowned in pale rose crepe, with matching headdress, and carried a tulle muff trimmed with pink and white carnations and maidenhair fern.
